



Boom

Training Program Outline

Goal

Trainees will be able to prepare and secure logs for transfer from a boom onto a vessel correctly and efficiently, following established safety precautions and practices and log boom working procedures.

Program Description

In this training program that combines classroom instruction with hands-on training, trainees develop knowledge of general, boom, and hold safety precautions and practices in addition to knowledge of boom equipment and the duties and responsibilities of the different boom workers. Trainees also develop knowledge of the working procedures on the log boom, in the hold, and on deck. Through demonstration and practice, trainees develop skills in tying basic knots and performing boom procedures including securing walking sticks, boom stick & boom line, securing tag lines, loading the hatch, cherry picking, hog lashing, top lashing and chaining up. Trainees are expected to pass a written quiz and to demonstrate an established performance level for each procedure.
