## Exploring the Olympic Impact on Marine Transportation

With 171 days to go, you can see the buildup to the Vancouver 2010 Olympics everywhere. The big question is how will it affect the Maritime Transportation Industry?

Some issues to keep in mind (encountered at prior Olympics) include; access issues, delays & restrictions of ship and cargo, & security risks.

### Security

The Vancouver Integrated Security Unit (VISU) has identified four Marine Areas of Interest around key Olympic venues - Coal Harbour, False Creek, Fraser River Middle Arm and Howe Sound adjacent to the Sea to Sky Hwy. Each of these areas will contain a controlled access zone and a tighter exclusion zone. Special security measures may effect normal maritime operations from mid January to March 2010.



Contingency planning began in 2007 to ensure that the CCG (Canadian Coast Guard) is able to adapt to changing conditions prior to and during the Games. Because the 2010 Winter Olympic and Paralympic Games involve sites along Vancouver's waterfront, the Coast Guard is involved in collaborative planning and works under the leadership of the RCMP, with regard to the safety and security of the four Marine Areas of Interest above.

### Dangerous Goods

Transport Canada will be announcing an interim Dangerous Goods Policy. The impact is expected to be minimal. An assessment of the current movement of dangerous goods was conducted, and major shippers were consulted well in advance and have agreed to assist by pre-planning the movement of these dangerous goods around the significant events. Class 1.1, 1.2, 1.5, and 7 radioactive materials (definitions & updated information at [www.tc.gc.ca/tdg/who.htm](http://www.tc.gc.ca/tdg/who.htm)) will likely be prohibited from arriving at the Centerm and Vanterm terminals.

### PortSecure 2010

Vancouver is the first port city to host the Winter Olympic games. Next year the Port of Metro Vancouver has been chosen to host PORTSECURE 2010, Canada's Annual Port & Maritime Security Conference. PORTSECURE is designed to prepare the Canadian industry for changing responsibilities related to security in international maritime commerce. The conference will be held May 26-28th at the Fairmont Pacific Rim, Vancouver BC.

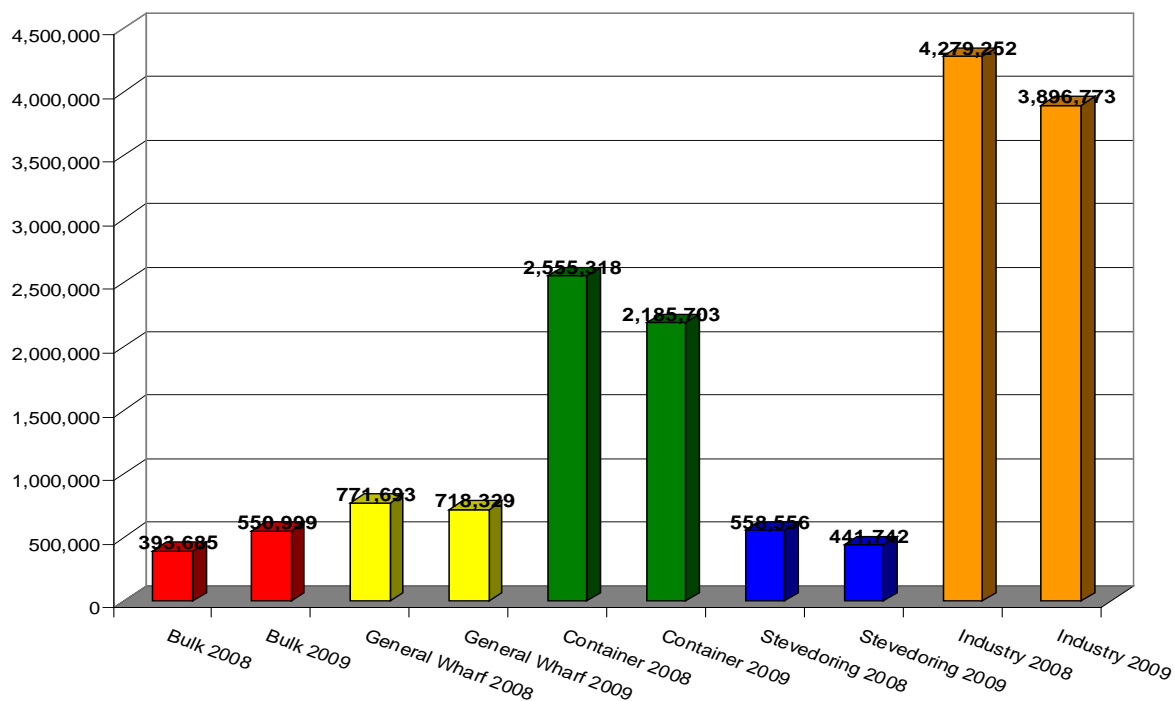

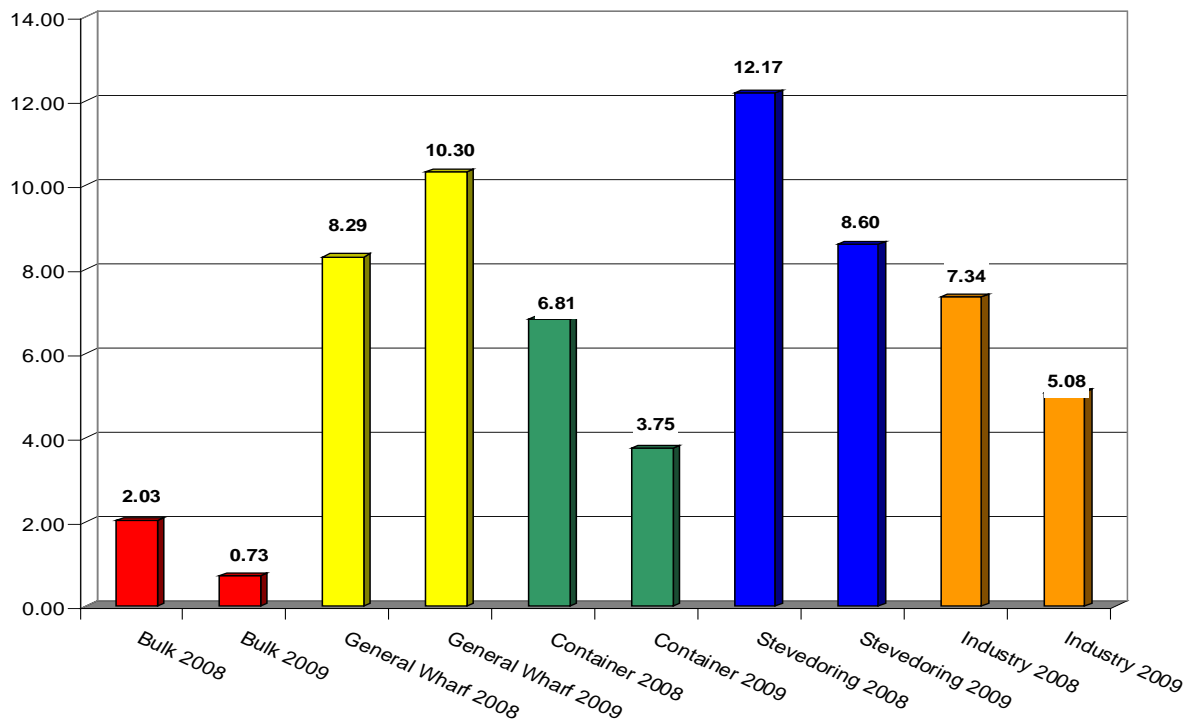

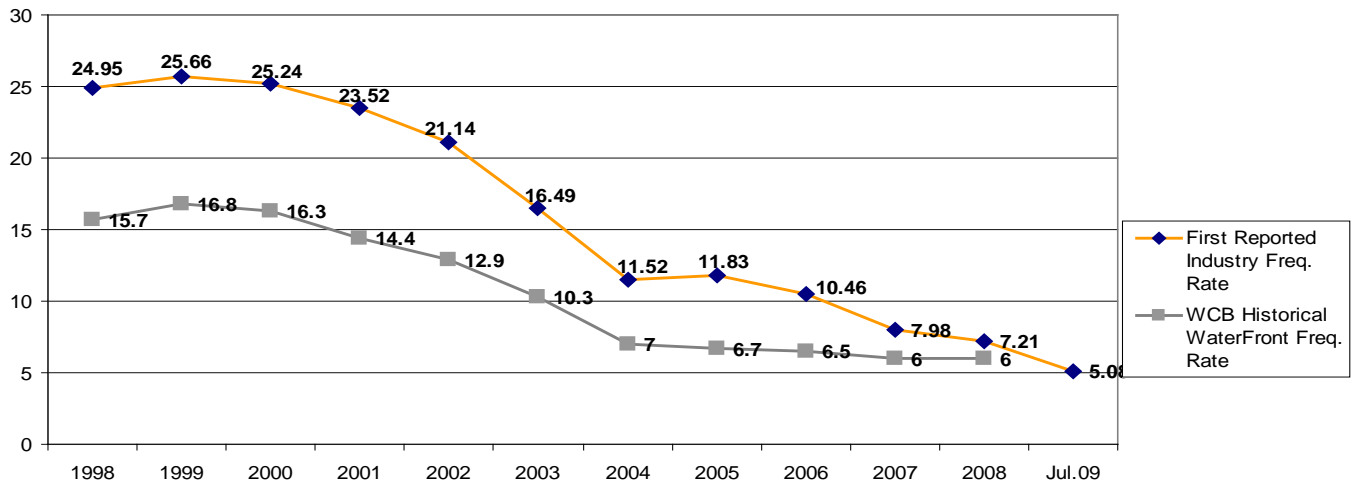
## Sectoral Hours Year - July 2008 vs. July 2009



## Sectoral Frequencies Year to Date to July 2008 vs. July 2009 Claims First Report



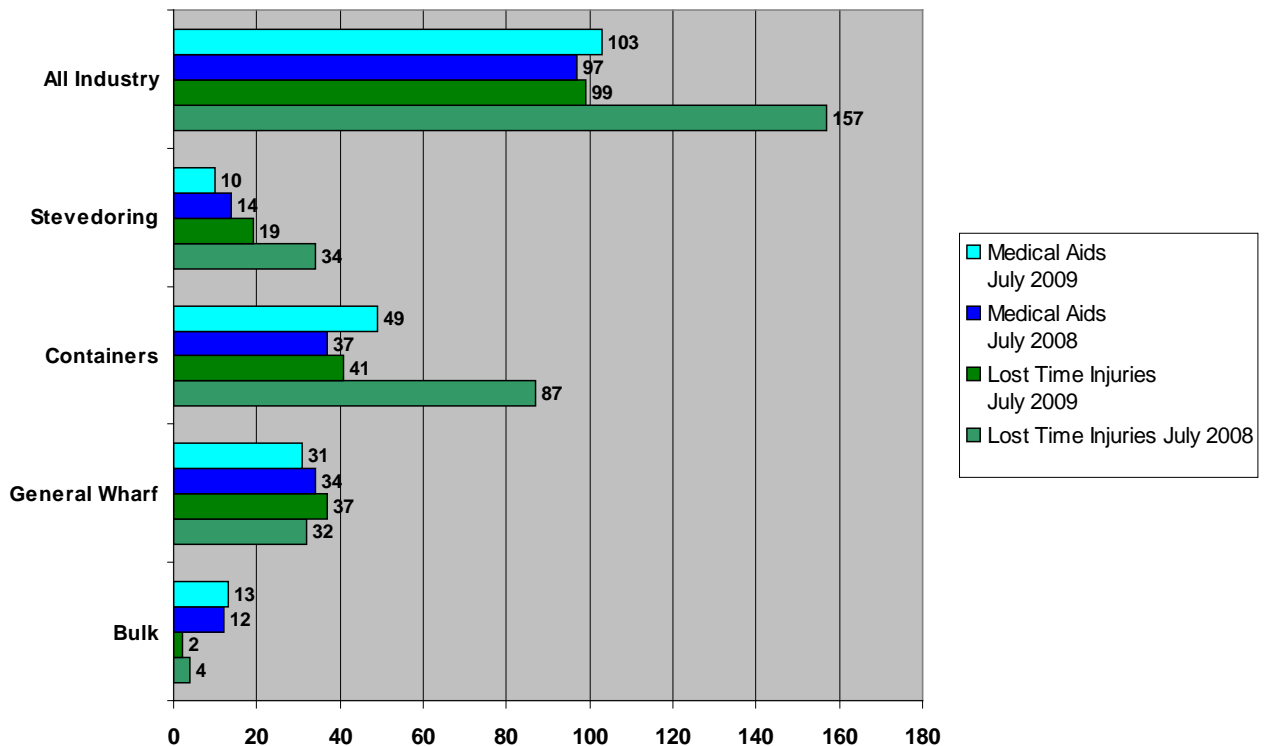
## Accident Frequency Year to Date to End of July 2009 Longshore and Foremen

2009 represents frequency year to date to July 2009.

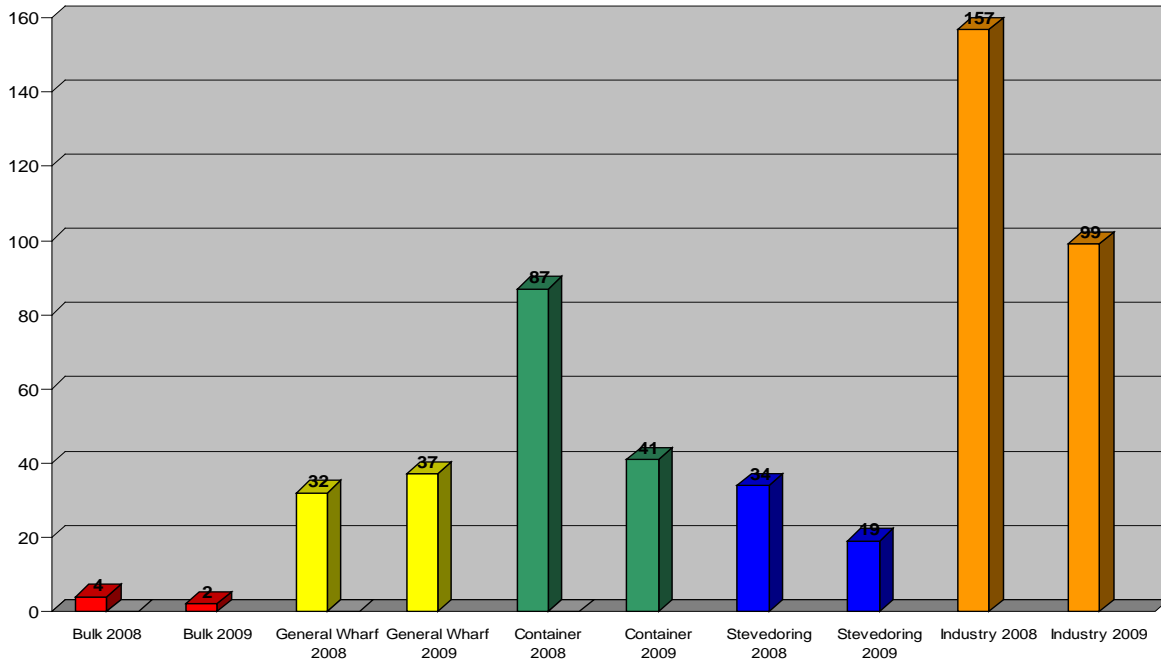
## Lost Time Injuries and Medical Aid 2008 - 2009

### Claims First Reported

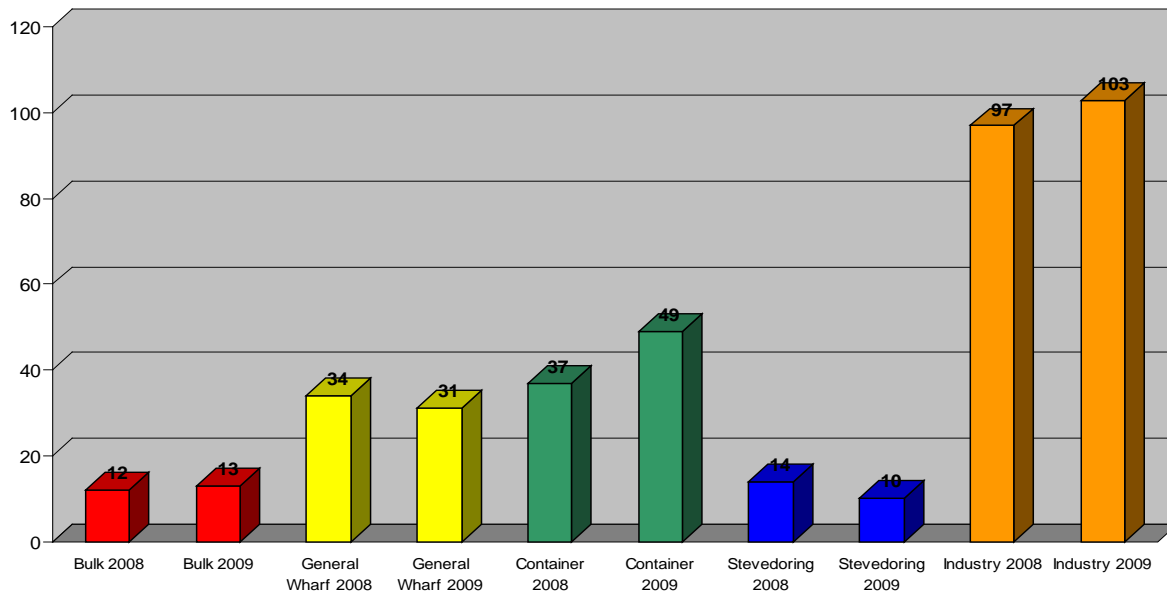


## Lost Time Injuries by Sector - July 2008 vs. July 2009

### Medical Aids by Sector July 2008 vs. July 2009



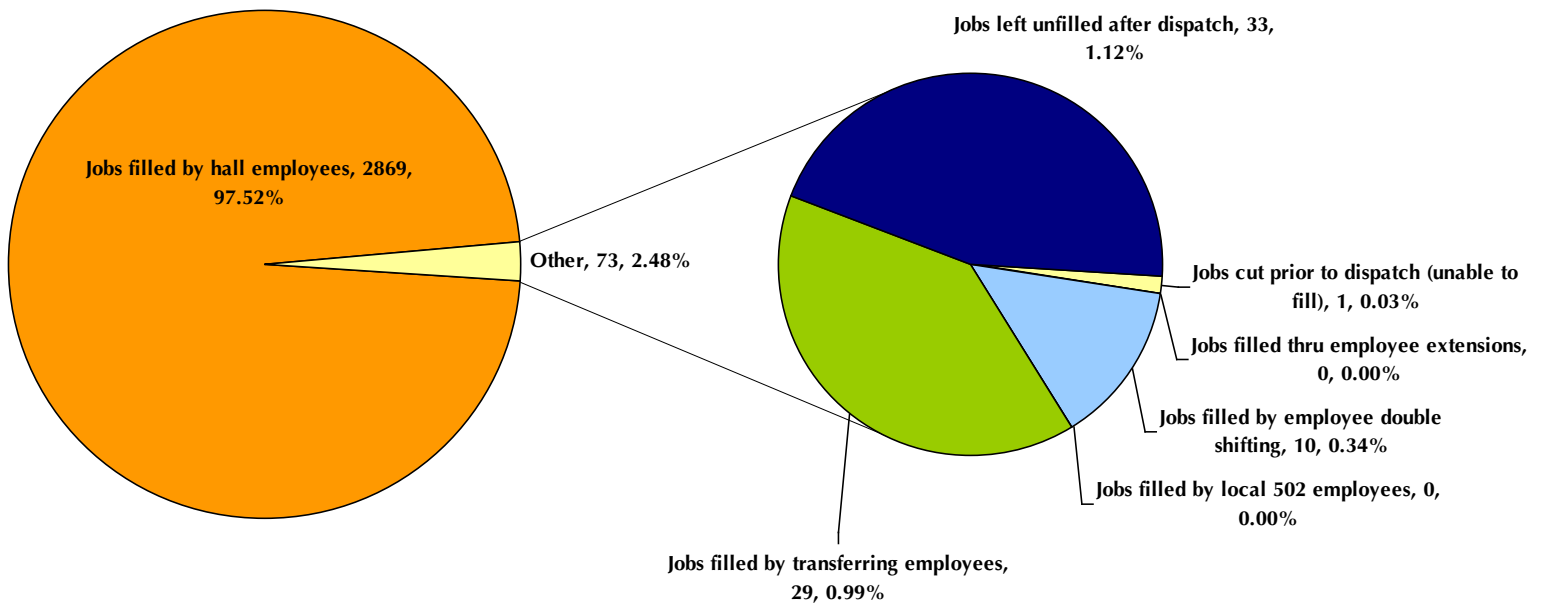

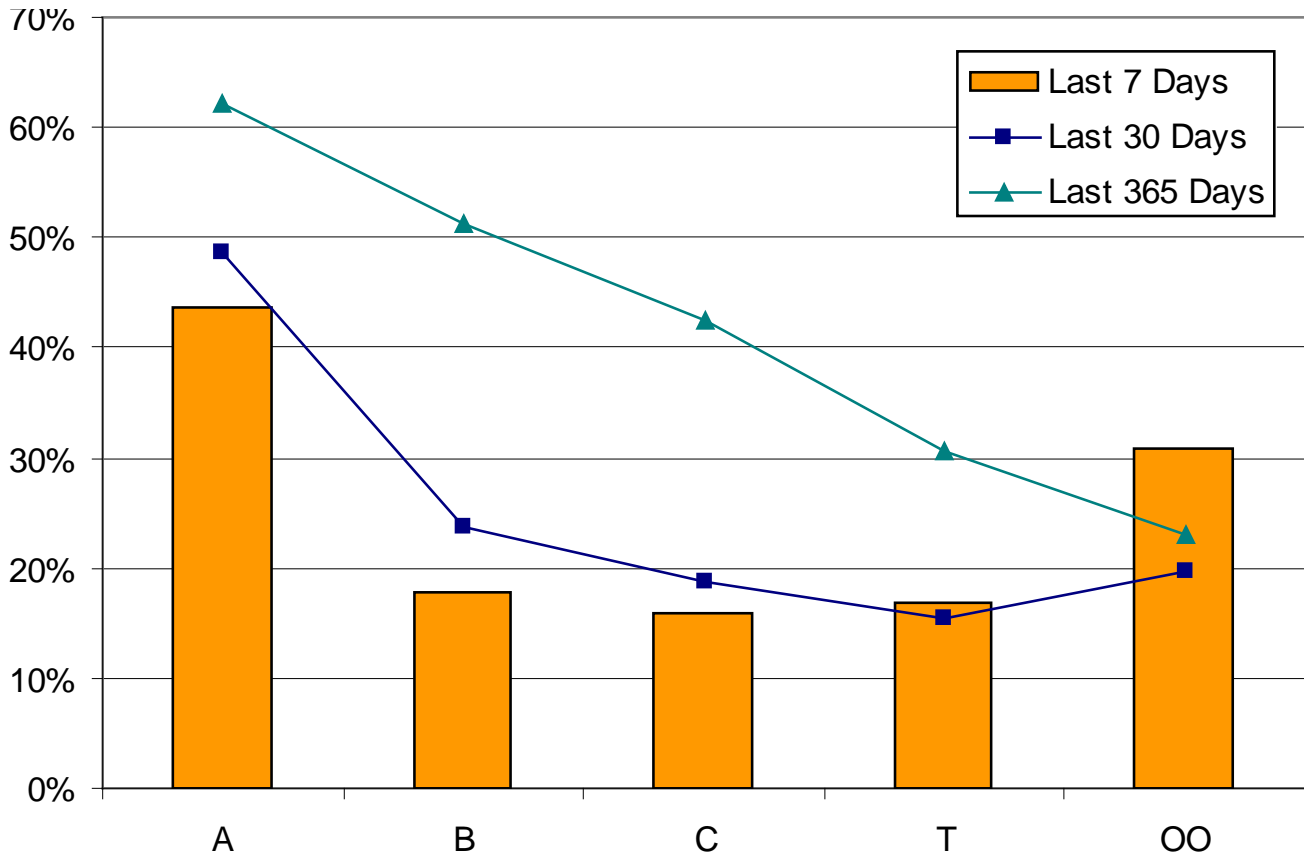
